Winter Term Costa Rica Program Option

The Program

The ICDS 11 week winter program is a customized program offering curriculum from the College of Nursing and Health Professions, from a Latin American perspective. Students gain a global perspective of heath care and related issues. ICDS partners with Hospital Clinicá Biblicá, Costa Rica's premier hospital to offer this customized Drexel curriculum. Students will strengthen their Spanish language skills and learn critical medical Spanish terminology in hands-on and interactive ways. Having Spanish skills plus knowledge of Latin American health issues will better prepare any student for working with the US' large Hispanic population.

Eliaibility requirements:

Class standing: Sophomore, pre-junior, juniors – must be scheduled for class during winter term

Majors: Nursing and Health Professions, Pre-med

Pre-requisite: Spanish 103 or equivalent. If student has studied Spanish before, they should take the

language placement test at Drexel's Modern Language Department to determine knowledge

level.

The Academics:

Students take 4 courses for a total of 16 credits. Students earn Drexel credit and grades for this program are factored into Drexel GPA.

- HSAD 480: The Health Care System in Costa Rica 3.0 credits fulfills sociology and health elective, social science, or free elective course.
- LANG 180: The Spanish for Health Sciences 6.0 credits fulfills humanities or free electives. Students are placed in a Spanish class for their appropriate language level.
- ECON 240: The Economics of Heath care 4.0 credits
- HSAD: Vulnerable Populations or HSAD Urban Health Care 3.0 credits

Winter term program calendar:

Arrival: early January

Departure: Late March, begin spring/summer co-op upon return to US.

Program Fee Winter 2014: \$2,100
